Egg Logic Puzzle

Grade Level: 4-8

Lesson Overview

A logic puzzle is a problem that can be solved using deductive reasoning. A deduction is a logical conclusion drawn from two or more true statements. One common type of logic puzzle involves a tool known as an elimination grid. In this activity, students will learn about eggs then use an elimination grid to solve a puzzle.

Student Objective

1. Practice logical thinking skills utilizing charts to draw conclusions based on information provided while learning about eggs.

Materials

✓ Egg Logic Puzzle Worksheet

Procedure

Allow students time to complete the Egg Logic Puzzle and then compare answers.

If you have not given your students a logic puzzle previously, you may want to help them understand the steps in finding an answer. Please keep in mind that not all of the information is given. Students should use the information available and the process of elimination to find the answers.
