The seeds can also be baked and made into a yummy snack.

How Pumpkins Grow

Pumpkins start as seeds. Farmers plant the seeds in the soil in the spring. Pumpkins need sunlight, water, and rich soil to grow into a pumpkin vine. The vine then makes blossoms, or flowers. After bees visit, the blossoms turn into tiny green pumpkins. Most pumpkins turn from green to orange. Pumpkins are picked in the fall.
