Introduction

Topic: Pork

Learning Objective:

The students will be able to make sense of pork-themed resources to solve directional, numeric, and word puzzles.

Storyline Objective:

Go through the clues surrounding the Hefty Hogs' missing mascot to unlock the box and uncover the motive behind the mascot's capture.

Story Background:

When we think of football, we think of pep bands, cheerleaders, tailgating, student sections, cornhole and especially rivalries. Rivalries are all good, until things get taken (literally) too far. That is exactly what happened between the Hefty Hogs and the Wolves when Boris, the Hefty Hogs' mascot, was taken from the team's locker room. These two football powerhouses, and storied rivals, had their matchup go awry – not because of what happened *on* the field, because of what happened *off* the field. The teams made headlines after the contentious matchup when the Hefty Hogs' mascot went missing. An article in the "Daily Pig News" identifies the party responsible for the event, but a motive has not yet been released. By using the details surrounding the rivalrous matchup, you will be able to unlock the box and uncover the motive behind the heist.

Initial Instructions:

- 1. Divide participants into groups.
- 2. Provide each group with a supply kit. They are not allowed to open their supply kit until the timer starts.
- 3. Read the story about the missing mascot, and the game notes (below).

Game notes:

- a) Escape coaches are available ONLY to verify the accuracy of a team's lock recording sheet. Coaches will not answer other questions during the game.
- b) A group may ask for TWO HINTS throughout the course of the game, and may not do so within the first ten minutes, or within ten minutes of receiving their first hint.
- c) The directional lock on the work sheet will only use four directions, not five. Players should cross off the last box on their sheet.
- d) Consider everything in the kit provided, and in the escape room area, to be a clue. Though, not everything will come into play.
- e) The small lock box contains clues which, though not entirely necessary, may prove helpful in cracking the codes to other locks. Any team that solves the 3-digit lock code may attempt to open the small box by first proving to an escape coach that the code is correct. After verifying the correct code, a team member may open the small box, remove ONE of the clues (they are all the same, and relock the box.

- f) When a group believes they have solved ALL the combinations, they will turn in their Lock Recording sheet for evaluation.
- g) The first team to correctly solve all the combinations will get to open the lockbox after the 45 minutes has expired. While waiting, they will discuss their challenge using the reflection prompts.
- 4. Set the timer for 45 minutes and begin.

*Hints**

Each team is allowed TWO hints throughout the course of the game. A team may not receive a hint within the first ten minutes of the game. A team may not receive a second hint within ten minutes of receiving their first hint.

**Provide hints based on the progress of the team.

Final Game Score - Remove the numbers shown below with a strikethrough from the newspaper.





Ticket – Say, "Those seated in Section U get a free pork chop at the concessions when they show a valid Section U **seat number** during halftime."

Crime Scene – Draw perpendicular arrows on the locker room floor plan.

Puzzles

Puzzle 1. – Directional Lock

Solution: Up, right, left, up

Materials: (Lock, Resources)

- Directional Lock
- Newspaper

Story Connection:

Following the criminal's (directional) trail solved the case.

Procedure:

- 1. Examine the locker room layout provided in the newspaper.
- 2. Use the locker room layout along with the following newspaper text to establish directions:
 - ↑ When I entered the locker room I immediately went to Boris's pen.
 - From there, I noticed unusual finger prints on the trophy case and walked over to look.
 - Someone had been trying to steal the trophies as well. I crossed the room to Duroc Johnson's locker where someone had written the words 'stinks' behind his name.
 - 1 knew the criminal would leave through the back door.

*Special Note: Some directional locks are comprised of 5 inputs for the combination (i.e. the fivewheel lock similar to the letter lock). Possible accommodations for this type of lock include:

- Include an "X" or blank space on fifth wheel and inform students ahead of time.

Puzzle 2. – 5-Letter Word Lock

Solution: C-H-O-P-S

Materials: (Lock, Resources)

- 5-Letter Word Lock
- Trading Cards
- Blacklight

Story Connection:

The locker room and players are the key to solving this case.

Procedure:

- 1. Identify 5 Hefty Hogs that are pork related.
- 2. Place the cards in order by their jersey number.
- 3. Use the blacklight to spell out the word "CHOPS" (Boris-Johnson-Shire-China-Landrace)

<u>Puzzle 3.</u> – 3-Digit Number Lock

Solution: 1-0-7

Materials: (Lock, Resources)

- 5-Digit Lock
- Ticket

Story Connection:

Tickets are needed for admittance to football games.

Procedure:

1. Scan the ticket to find the seat number. The seat number is the 3-digit code.

<u>Puzzle 4.</u> – 4-Digit Number Lock

Solution: 3-0-2-7

Materials: (Lock, Resources)

- 4-digit number lock
- Newspaper

Story Connection:

An important part of a football game is the final score.

Procedure:

- Locate the "Hefty Hogs Defense Suffocates Wolves" article on page 2 of the newspaper.
- Read the article.
- Notice the 30-27 score is described as "relevant." It is relevant because it is the 4-digit code.

Hometown, IL-


Hometown's heroes, The Hefty Hog football team, were in shock Saturday following the discovery that their beloved mascot, Boris, was missing.

PORK POWER



ILLINOIS HOG FARMING ON RISE

FARINA - There's been a boom in the application for hog facility expansions throughout Illinois. The increase in swine facilities is attributed to rising prices and greater demand, especially from Asia. Some Illinois farmers, like Jason Sigrist from rural Farina, have gone into hog production because of more stable prices for swine than field crops, such as corn and soybeans. Receiving about 5,000 piglets at a time, Sigrist raises the little ones until they reach 80 pounds, at which time Equity takes half of them. The rest are raised to their full growth of 290-300 pounds. After about six months, the full-grown pigs are taken to market and the cycle begins anew. Sigrist believes he made the right decision to expand into hog production as the outlook for the future is good. ◆


