ROADS, RIVERS, AND RAILS

Follow these prompts to make your very own transportation-and Illinois agriculture-themed board game!

Board Game

Items Needed

Die (or make one using the included paper die template) Game pieces for each player 30 second sand timer (or digital timer of your choice) Large posterboard or sheet of paper (roughly 25" x 30" or larger) Small sticky notes or slips of paper in various colors (11/2" x 2" work best) Markers, colored pencils, scissors, and assorted art supplies





Create Your Playing Board

- 1. Arrange 40-60 tiles (sticky notes) in a zig-zag path across the game board.
- 2. On the first tile, write "Start".
- 3. On the last tile, write "Finish".
- 4. Draw a bridge that connects two separate sections of tiles. Write on the tiles at the beginning and end of the bridge, "Cross the bridge!"
- 5. Draw a river that connects two separate sections of tiles. Write on the tiles at the beginning and end of the river, "Float down the river!"
- 6. Draw a railroad in a straight line that connects at least three tiles from across the game board.

- 7. On each tile that the railroad intersects, write "Move to next railway station!"
- 8. Label the instruction tiles: be sure to scatter these around the board!
 - Write "Move back 1 space" on 5 tiles.
 - Write "Move ahead 2 spaces" on 5 tiles.
 - Write "Lose your next turn" on 3 tiles.
 - Write "Draw a Question card" on 10 tiles.
 - Write "Draw a Transport Card" on 8 tiles.
- 9. Cut out the Question cards and Transport cards and stack them into two piles.

Decorate Your Playing Board

IL ranks #2 in the country for how much corn it grows. Draw an ear of field corn on your game board.

IL ranks #1 in the country for how many soybeans it grows. Draw a soybean pod on your game board.

IL ranks #4 in how many pigs we produce. Draw some tasty bacon on your game board.

We must use transportation to move all these agricultural products all around the state, country, and world. Draw a semi truck, tractor, delivery van, barge, and train.

IL has many dairies that produce milk from dairy cows. Draw your favorite dairy product on the game board.


IL produces more pumpkins than any other state in the US. Draw a big pumpkin on the game board.

Cut out the "Roads. Rivers, and Rails Board Game Logo" and tape or glue it to your game board.

IL corn and soybeans are fed to many livestock animals, like beef cattle. **Draw your favorite food** that is made with beef.

Instructions for Play

- Set all game pieces on the Start tile.
- Each player should draw one Transport Card.
- The player with the earliest birthday in the year will go first by rolling the die.
- Each player will take turns rolling the die and moving their game pieces the number of tiles that is rolled on the die.
- If a player lands on a tile with instructions, they must follow the instructions before ending their turn. See below for details!
- Players only need to follow the tiles with instructions if they land on them.




Transport Cards

Players should draw 1 Transport Card at the beginning of the game and any time they land on a "Draw a Transport Card" tile. Players can read their cards right away and place them face up near them. Some Transport Cards can only be used before or during a player's turn, while others can be used during an opponent's turn. There are instructions for use on each Transport Card. There is no limit to the number of Transport Cards players can have.

Question Cards

Players should draw one Question Card when they land on a "Draw a Question Card" tile.

After reading the question, the player has 30 seconds to answer the question - use the timer here! The player may use the Ag Mag or other resources to find the information needed to answer the question. The players should follow the prompt on the Question card based on if they answered correctly or incorrectly.




If you notice any issues with where certain tiles are on the board, don't worry! Just move the tiles to a better spot to make the game play better.





Instructions For Paper Die:


Cut on the solid line around the entire outside of the die
